School Improvement Plan Goal #1

By the end of the academic year, at least 85% of students with disabilities will demonstrate proficiency and/or make a learning gain in ELA, as measured by standardized assessments.

Monitoring:

Progress of our SWDs will be tracked during each progress monitoring window. Initial proficiency will be demonstrated during Fall testing (PM1). Scores will be compared from PM1 to the winter testing (PM2). Students who are not making adequate progress toward proficiency and/ or a learning gain will be highlighted and discussed during MTSS Core team meetings and collaborative team meetings to determine what more can be done to ensure success. If needed, IEP meetings will be scheduled to adjust goals, accommodations, and/or services for those students. The final testing window in the spring (PM3) will determine if our SWDs are proficient in ELA and if they made a learning gain.

A spreadsheet will be created to track the progress of our SWDs from one testing window to the next. The spreadsheet will include the student's identified disability, ESE minutes, ELA related goals on the IEP, data from each progress monitoring period, and any other pertinent information that can be utilized to make informed decisions.

Interventions:

• Teachers will implement district approved curriculum and interventions with fidelity. They will provide accommodations as stated on IEPs and utilize common assessments to monitor student learning. They will provide reteaching/remediation in targeted small groups weekly. ESE teachers/case managers/service providers will attend collaborative team meetings weekly. This will ensure that classroom teachers and ESE teachers are collaborating on the students they share. Having open, honest dialogue, problem solving, creating action plans, collecting data, and reviewing progress will benefit the students and give them a better chance at standards-mastery and academic growth.

School Improvement Plan Goal #2

1) Grade level collaborative teams will meet at 3-4 times per month to address one or more of the following questions: What do we want the students to learn? – planning for essential standards, learning targets, develop common assessments How will we know if they have learned it? – common assessments that are connected to learning targets and sharing data What will we do if they don't learn it? – additional/different instruction and support (i.e. WIN, ESE, etc) What do we do if they already know it? – enrich, extend go deeper in content

Monitoring:

- Members of the leadership team will be present at all collaborative team meetings. We will provide support as needed.
- School leaders will be present and have a clear process for regularly reviewing agendas/notes/action steps.
- Members of the leadership team will pose the right questions and model what is valued.
- Data will be collected and analyzed during each progress monitoring window (fall, winter, spring).

Interventions:

- Collaborative teams need a designated time to meet and address one or more of the guiding
 questions for PLCs. School leaders will create a master schedule that allows for the time that
 collaborative teams will meet.
- School leaders will strategically communicate a clear and compelling vision for collaborative planning and high-functioning teams from the start of the school year and revisit this vision throughout the year as needed. Administration will be present and active in collaborative team meetings to ensure the vision is clearly communicated and monitored throughout the year.
- Collaborative teams will establish norms and roles to guide the work they do together each month.
- We want to acknowledge the good work that is being done in our school and provide guidance and support if teams are not functioning with the "all means all" mentality.
