Notes from the Clinic

Please be sure to pack extra clothes for your children as clinic visits are very limited.

When and how should face masks be washed?

Masks are an additional step to help slow the spread of COVID-19 when combined with every day preventive actions and social distancing in public settings. Masks should be washed regularly. It is important to always remove masks correctly and wash your hands after handling or touching a used mask.

How to clean

Washing machine

- You can include your mask with your regular laundry. (Throw them in a clean mesh laundry bag or clean white sock to delicately wash them)
- Use regular laundry detergent and the warmest appropriate water setting for the cloth used to make the mask.

Washing by hand

- Check the label to see if your bleach is intended for disinfection. Some bleach products, such as those designed for safe use on colored clothing, may not be suitable for disinfection.
 - Use bleach containing 5.25%–8.25% sodium hypochlorite. Do not use a bleach product if the percentage is not in this range or is not specified.
 - Ensure the bleach product is not past its expiration date. Never mix household bleach with ammonia or any other cleanser.
 - Ensure adequate ventilation.
- · Prepare a bleach solution by mixing:
 - 5 tablespoons (1/3rd cup) of 5.25%–8.25% bleach per gallon of room temperature water or
 - 4 teaspoons of 5.25%–8.25% bleach per quart of room temperature water
- Soak the mask in the bleach solution for 5 minutes.
- Discard the bleach solution down the drain and rinse the mask thoroughly with cool or room temperature water.
- Make sure to completely dry the mask after washing.

Student Health Screening Entry Form

Please assess your child daily for the following symptoms and answer the contact questions.

- Fever of 100.4 or higher
- Uncontrolled cough
- · Shortness of breath or difficulty breathing
- Sore throat
- Loss of sense of smell or taste
- Muscle aches
- Vomiting or diarrhea
- Is your child currently awaiting COVID-19 test results?
- Does your child live in the same household with someone positive for COVID-19?
- Has your child had close contact with someone who in the past 14 days who tested positive for COVID-19?

HEALTH SERVICES

STUDENT SYMPTOM CRITERIA CHECKLIST

Due to the nature of communicable illnesses and during this time of COVID-19 Pandemic, in addition to symptoms of commonly occurring illnesses, any student presenting with the following symptoms will be sent to the school nurse for assessment. Parents will be contacted regarding student pick-up.

Symptom criteria from the Florida Chapter of the American Academy of Pediatrics states students who meet the screening criteria below should be sent home for further medical evaluation.

TWO OR MORE OF THE FOLLOWING:

- Chills
- Muscle aches
- Headache
- Sore throat
- New decrease in smell or taste

OR ONE OF THE FOLLOWING:

- Fever of 100.4 or higher
- Uncontrolled cough
- Shortness of breath
- Vomiting and/or diarrhea

Your child must be evaluated by a healthcare provider and must present a clearance note to return to school. Contact your healthcare provider or the Department of Health regarding your child's symptoms.

Per CDC and AAP guidelines, if your child is not medically evaluated, he/she must remain at home for at least 10 days from the first day symptoms appeared AND 24 hours fever free without fever-reducing medications AND improvement of symptoms.

If you decide to not have your child medically evaluated and choose to keep him/her home for the 10 day recommendation, you must send a written note stating such with your child upon their return to school.



Hello and welcome back! I am Jessica Peto the Food and Nutrition manager for PV/Rawlings. Every child this year will be provided with a lunch account number. We are switching back to paypams.com for lunch payments. All positive and negative balance will switch over from schoolpay to paypams.com You will have to make a new login. Your old login will not work. Also, on paypams.com you will be able to see your child's purchases and how much money they have left on their account. You may also send in money with your student. Please have your students first and last name in a sealed envelope. Also, on paypams.com you can sign up for alerts about your student's account. Please keep your student's account current. Your child may get breakfast every day. Your child's breakfast includes breakfast entrée, fruit, juice and milk. Your child's lunch includes a choice of one entrée, choice of vegetables, choice of fruit and milk. If your child gets a second entrée, then he or she will be charged as ala carte. We also have a one cool box daily for lunch that includes yogurt, graham crackers, slice apples carrot dippers w/ranch, choice of another vegetable and milk. Cafeteria Mems

The U.S. Department of Agriculture extended waivers allowing students a breakfast and lunch option available at no cost. The meals available at no cost are the posted school lunch and breakfast menu. A la carte items are not included as part of the no cost meals. A la carte items will continue to be available for purchase. Meals are also available for pick-up at all schools for anyone 18 years old or younger. Meals available for pick-up are modified for safety and may not reflect the menu served in the cafeteria. It is preferred that children are present for meal pickup. If the child/student is not with the parent for meal pick up, USDA requires a form of ID. Valid forms of identification may include, but are not limited to, school identification card, child's passport, government-issued child identification card, or any document proving parent/guardian identity and relationship to the child, such as an adoption decree; doctor, clinic, or hospital record; religious record; or daycare center record.

<u>Meal pick-up times are as follows</u>: Middle Schools and Gaines/Transitions: 8:30-9 am Elementary Schools and K-8 Schools: 9 – 9:30 am High Schools: 9:45 – 10:15 am *Gamble Rogers Middle School: 8 – 8:30 am

*Meal pick-up locations vary by school. Please contact the Cafeteria Manager at each school for the pick-up location. The program will begin on September 10, 2020. The longevity of this extension is dependent on funding.

DISTANCE LEARNING MEALS

- ONLY for School based distance learning students.
 Does NOT include St. Johns Virtual or Home school students.
- Based on eligibility at student's home school. Students meals must be picked up from their enrolled school.
- No cash accepted must prepay using PayPams.com
- Parents must know students lunch pin numbers or students' full names and grade.
- The meals will consist of Breakfast and Lunch for the day of service. This will contain the classroom friendly lunch entrée, cold breakfast entrée and (must contain 3 milks) chocolate or white. Follow the menu with fruit and vegetable for the day.

Blessings in a Backpack

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
